WHAT IS SAFETY POLICY?

Safety Policy — Establishes senior management's commitment to continually improve safety; defines the methods, processes, and organizational structure needed to meet safety goals.

For company in Aviation Industry, safety policy must,

- Establishes management commitment to safety performance through SMS.
- Establishes clear safety objectives and commitment to manage to those objectives.
- Defines methods, processes, and organizational structure needed to meet safety goals.
- Establishes transparency in management of safety, for example,
 - Fully documented policy and processes must be visible to all.
 - > Employee reporting and resolution system to improve safety culture for that organisation.
 - > Accountability of management and employees & their roles.
- Facilitates cross-organizational communication and cooperation.

SAFETY POLICY GREATLY AFFECTS SAFETY CULTURE AND SAFETY PERFORMANCE.

"Safety Policy" is a major asset for building an effective safety culture in aviation Safety Management Systems (SMS). An aviation SMS is a complex system of inter-related components and elements, and "Safety Policy" is one of the four SMS components (or pillars). For a quick review, the four SMS components are:



The **effective treatment of a safety policy** component will positively influence the other three components to **build a healthy and durable safety culture**. For examples, Safety Policy affects the other three components, such as:

- Safety Policy elements should be included as an SMS training requirement (Safety Promotion component).
- Safety Policy outlines employee protections from management for self-reporting errors and mistakes, therefore, safety policy becomes instrumental in stimulating hazard reporting behaviours (Safety Assurance component); and
- Safety Policy defines the scope of the aviation SMS, which becomes essential in Safety Risk Management activities.

The Safety Policy is about building a skeleton framework for SMS implementation in terms of:



Therefore, to ensure the Safety of an organization is well establish, company must have their own company Safety Policy.

GAM SAFETY POLICY

Galaxy Aerospace (GAM) SAFETY POLICY was created in 2016 in conjunction with the beginning of this company. This Safety Policy must be agreed and signed by the Accountable Executive (Managing Director) of GAM.
