**EXTENSION TO THE VALIDITY PERIOD OF CAAM PART 66  
BASIC KNOWLEDGE EXAMINATION**

**1 Introduction**

- 1.1 This Civil Aviation Notice (CAN) is issued by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM), in exercise of the powers conferred by section 24O of the Civil Aviation Act 1969 [Act 3].
- 1.2 Civil Aviation Directives (CAD) 1801 which is effective from 1<sup>st</sup> May 2021 requires that the basic knowledge examinations shall have been passed within 7 years prior to the application for Aircraft Maintenance Licence (AML).
- 1.3 Following Movement Control Order (MCO) announced by the Government of Malaysia on 18 March 2020, conduct of basic training and examination has been suspended for educational institutions which also includes Maintenance Training Organisation (MTO).

**2 Purpose**

- 2.1 CAAM is aware that some individual applicants may experience disruptions to his/her AML progress during the COVID-19 period that not only posed significant risk to one's health but also imposed travel restrictions (MCO) whereby training organisations and examination centres were not able to function normally.
- 2.2 In order to facilitate affected AML applicants, CAAM through the issuance of this CAN exempts paragraph 3.1.2 of CAD 1801 – basic knowledge examinations shall have been passed within 7 years prior to the application for AML, by granting an extension period of 2 years from the expiry date of the affected basic module examinations subject to the conditions specified below:
- a) Applicants who have passed basic module examinations in which the expiry date is between 18 March 2020 and 31 December 2021 inclusive;

- 2.3 The Quality Manager of the organisation responsible for making recommendation for AML application, either MTO or Approved Maintenance Organisation (AMO) shall:
- a) identify potential applicants and ensure that the conditions specified in paragraph 2.2 are met;
  - b) submit a list to CAAM containing at least details of the affected module(s) and its original expiry date and new expiry date based on the CAN; and
  - c) provide a risk assessment report.
- 2.4 The list and the supporting documents specified in paragraph 2.3 shall be submitted to CAAM by 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022. After this date, there will be no other extensions will be granted.
- 2.5 For applicants who do not meet the conditions in paragraph 2.2 above, paragraph 3.1.2 of CAD 1801 will still apply.
- 2.6 All other requirements in CAD 1801 remains applicable based on the original effective date and compliance shall be demonstrated by the applicant accordingly.
